		FYI	HAZARD ANALYSIS CRITICAL CONTROL POINT	
			- Keep potentially hazardous food requiring time/temperature controls for safety out of the temperature danger zone of 41° F – 135° F [use a clean and sanitized metal-stem thermometer to monitor food package temperatures]	
			- Wash hands frequently at hand sink, especially before using gloves – double hand washing required after using the restroom	
			- Chlorine: 50-100 ppm in tub, immersion for 10 seconds; 75° F 100-200 ppm for swabbing, moist-wipe cloth, spray bottle; 75° F (keep bottles labeled and properly stored)	
			- Recommend documenting temperatures of refrigeration units, freezing units, food package temperatures, sanitizer concentrations, etc., on a log sheet	
			- Make sure all outer opening doors are self-closing & tight-fitting	
			- Make sure exterior packaged ice freezer (Home City Ice) and exterior wood shed are kept locked at all times except when in use for food security & safety.	
			- Make sure all food products obtained for sale are from APPROVED sources and meet temperature food safety guidelines during transportation
